Here at Tiggywinkles, we are dedicated to rescuing and rehabilitating British wildlife. We are open 24hrs a day, 7 days a week to help any wild animal in need and our service is free of charge. We rely on donations to provide our life-saving care for patients like Robbie the robin, who arrived in our care under unusual circumstances!



As the World's leading teaching wildlife hospital, we have lots of students on site and one of our Level Two Animal Care students found Robbie on the pathway of our grounds. She immediately realised he needed help as he was lying flat and couldn't fly. She rushed him into triage and our duty nurse quickly assessed his condition.

Sadly, Robbie was suffering from temporary ataxia – the loss of coordination and control of movement – and the team suspected he had sustained head trauma. To treat his symptoms, our vet put Robbie on a short course of antibiotics and pain relief. After one week of treatment, Robbie was once again flying around his cage and was ready for release.

We are so happy that we could help this beautiful bird back to the wild and although we never want any wild animal to find itself in trouble, it is nice to think that they know where to come, should they ever need help! Our doors are always open to any wild animal in need, even walk-ins! To help us care for patients like Robbie, please consider donating. Reduced Inheritance Tax (IHT) liability... increased charitable legacy

Leaving a legacy to charity as part of a Will is a laudable decision, although choosing which charity or charities can be difficult! There are benefits associated with leaving a legacy. For example, where 10% or more of the net estate of a deceased (after the deduction of exemptions, reliefs and the nil-rate band) is left to charity, a reduced IHT rate of 36% applies, compared to the standard rate of 40%.

While leaving a legacy is a tick in the estate planning box, for wealthier people especially it only scratches the surface. Making annual gifts, putting some cash, investments or property into a trust, and taking out a suitable life policy are just a few other actions to consider.

The larger or more complex the estate is likely to be, the greater the need for professional financial advice. Reducing an individual's IHT liability could well lead to an increased charitable legacy as well as benefitting loved ones.
