






# FRIENDS of the Animals

# Truly a picture to lift the heart!



At 'Friends of the Animals' we have lots of success stories and I thought you would like to read about a recent one – and see this FABULOUS photo. It is one which should make everyone who intervened when this lovely Collie was attacked, 'incredibly proud'.

Ju-Ju, an 11 month old Collie bitch, was brought over to the I.O.W. by a holidaymaker from London. Shoppers were shocked to see him beating her in the street. The level of violence he directed at the dog, caused several people to intervene and one man was so enraged, he physically stopped the owner from hurting 'Ju-Ju'. The Police were called and both men were arrested, but the hero bystander was quickly released without charge.

When this lovely dog came into 'Friends of the Animals' care, she was in a pitiful condition.

She was very lame and couldn't put one of her front paws to the ground. A pin in her leg had moved and was poking through the skin. We discovered, that she'd undergone surgery six months previously. The owner had not taken her back to the Vet, which meant she was still wearing a six month old, filthy bandage. No wonder the wound was badly infected. Poor Ju-Ju also had a paw so badly crushed the bones have fused together, she had also been stabbed. We couldn't help wondering how a puppy, who would have been little more than 5 month old at the time, had sustained such terrible injuries!



Ju-Ju was signed over to us and was taken to the Vet, where she was x-rayed and the infected wound was cleaned and dressed. She was then safely settled into a foster home with a fabulous garden.

A few days later, we took her back to the Vet and she had the pin (which was poking through her leg) removed and, a few weeks later, we had her spayed. When we were told an amputation was still a distinct possibility, we all prayed her leg could be saved.

Ju-Ju's injuries have left her with permanent damage, which will cause problems for her as she ages, but she is no longer in pain and she loves her daily exercise.



......'I think I'm going to like it here'!

I'm delighted to say, there is a very happy ending as her Foster family fell in love with her. They couldn't bear to see her have to adjust to another family, so decided to keep her. Now re-named 'J.J'. she is living very happily with Angus the Cockerpoo and Reggie a rescue from Cyprus. All three dogs lie on the sofa together, life for this dog who has clearly suffered so much, has just begun.

In Court, statements from bystanders who'd witnessed J.J. being beaten, were used as evidence in the case. The ex-owner pleaded guilty to causing an animal unnecessary suffering and the story made the news. He was fined £2,000 and banned from keeping an animal for 10 years. Unbelievably, he claimed to Police the dog had caused the stab wounds to herself! Really?





Here at Tiggywinkles, we are dedicated to rescuing and rehabilitating British wildlife. We are open 24hrs a day, 7 days a week to help any wild animal in need and our service is free of charge. We rely on donations to provide our life-saving care for patients like Robbie the robin, who arrived in our care under unusual circumstances!



As the World's leading teaching wildlife hospital, we have lots of students on site and one of our Level Two Animal Care students found Robbie on the pathway of our grounds. She immediately realised he needed help as he was lying flat and couldn't fly. She rushed him into triage and our duty nurse quickly assessed his condition.

Sadly, Robbie was suffering from temporary ataxia – the loss of coordination and control of movement – and the team suspected he had sustained head trauma. To treat his symptoms, our vet put Robbie on a short course of antibiotics and pain relief. After one week of treatment, Robbie was once again flying around his cage and was ready for release.

We are so happy that we could help this beautiful bird back to the wild and although we never want any wild animal to find itself in trouble, it is nice to think that they know where to come, should they ever need help! Our doors are always open to any wild animal in need, even walk-ins! To help us care for patients like Robbie, please consider donating. We receive no government or lottery funding, so we need your help – every penny helps us help them!
