Midlands Air Ambulance Charity serves the largest air ambulance region in the UK. This includes the communities of Gloucestershire, Herefordshire, Shropshire, Staffordshire, West Midlands and Worcestershire; representing a population in excess of 6 million.

Since flying its first mission in 1991, the charity has now responded to more than 47,000 incidents, averaging 2,000 missions each year. If a patient reaches hospital within 60 minutes of injury (known as the Golden Hour), their chances of survival are dramatically increased. All areas of the region are accessible in 19 minutes and 90% of the region is accessible within eight minutes.

Each year it costs in excess of £9 million to maintain the three aircraft and the provision of a lifesaving service. Each air ambulance mission costs an average of £2,500. The charity receives no regular funding from the Government or National Lottery so relies entirely on the support and generosity of local people and businesses.


